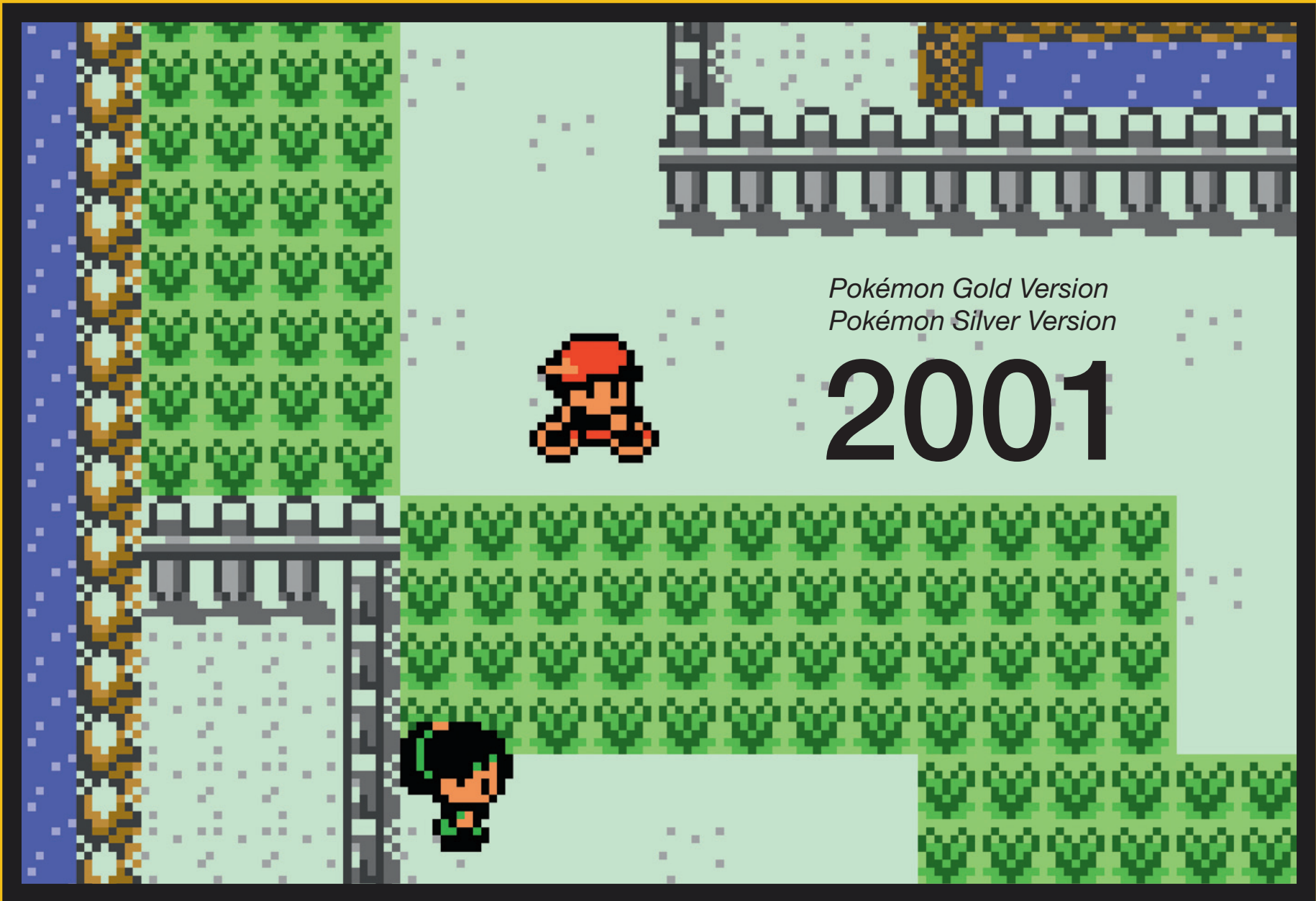

What are Pokémon?

Pokémon are fascinating creatures harbouring many mysteries. Some live in harmony with humans, while others live on grassy plains, caves or the ocean.

Taking on the role of a Pokémon Trainer, players will encounter many different Pokémon and can recruit them by “catching” them, before nurturing and raising them.



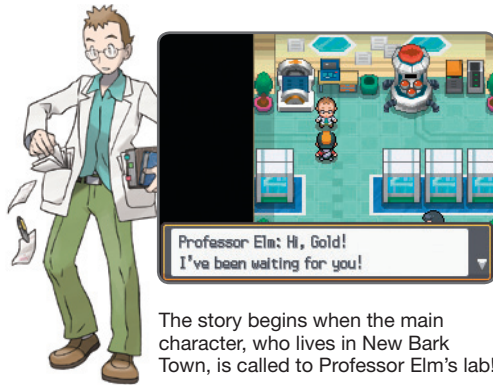

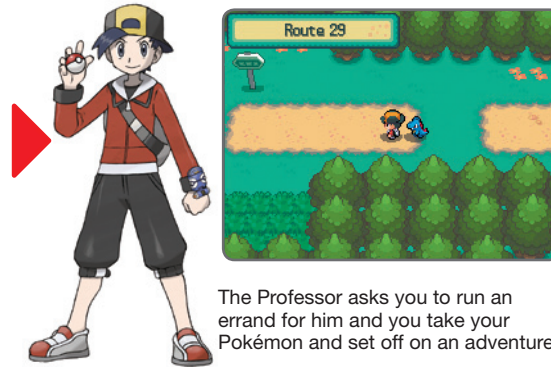

The story begins when the main character, who lives in New Bark Town, is called to Professor Elm's lab!



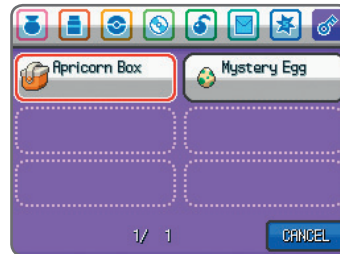
The Professor asks you to run an errand for him and you take your Pokémon and set off on an adventure!

Ho-Oh / Lugia

At the climax of *Pokémon HeartGold Version*, you'll encounter Ho-Oh and in *Pokémon SoulSilver Version* you'll see Lugia.



- Lugia will also appear in *Pokémon HeartGold Version* and Ho-Oh will also appear in *Pokémon SoulSilver Version* if you can make it to the Hall of Fame*.



Differences between *Pokémon HeartGold Version* and *Pokémon SoulSilver Version*

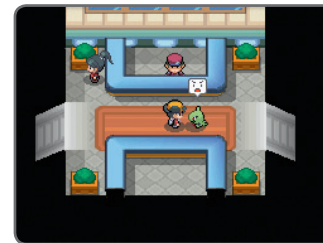


Keep your Pokémon by your side!

The game allows you to take the lead Pokémon of your team out walking with you. From your initial Pokémon all the way to the Legendary Pokémon, you can take any one of them out and have them walk with you as you stroll around.



All Pokémon, both big and small, will follow you.



Whether smiling or frowning, your Pokémon will show you expressions you've never seen before as you talk to them.



Sometimes, your Pokémon will pick up items for you too.

A new event – the Pokéathlon

The Pokéathlon is an event where you and your Pokémon can compete to see who has the best “Speed”, “Power”, “Skill”, “Stamina” and “Jump”. Enter the three Pokémon best suited to each course and use teamwork to earn your points. At the end you will get “Athlete Pts.” which you can exchange for all sorts of prizes.



The competition facilities are located in a certain city.

Jump over the hurdles and see who gets to the finish line the fastest. Tap your Pokémon with your stylus to make them jump. Three of them will run alongside each other, so you have to control all of them at the same time.

You also get a Pokéwalker accessory

a fun pedometer you can use to walk about with your Pokémon

Each purchase of *Pokémon HeartGold Version* or *Pokémon SoulSilver Version* comes with one Pokéwalker accessory.



Number of steps

It comes with a special hook so you can attach it to your belt when you walk.



• You cannot use the pedometer function with the Pokéwalker accessory alone. (you need a connection with the game)

• Each individually purchased game can only communicate with one Pokéwalker

1 Choose a Pokémon to go out on a stroll with

You can take one of your Pokémon from your *Pokémon HeartGold Version* or *Pokémon SoulSilver Version* game out on a stroll with you.

2 Walk:

As you walk around, the Pokéwalker accessory will count the number of steps you take. The more steps you take, the greater your friendship becomes and the more Experience Points your Pokémon earns.



You'll store up Watts (W) as you walk.

It will even count your steps if you put it in your bag or your pocket.

3 Reward:

You can use the Watts you've stored up to catch wild Pokémon and find items.



Use infrared to transfer the Pokémon and items you've acquired to your Nintendo DS.

You can catch Pokémon with your Pokéwalker as well!



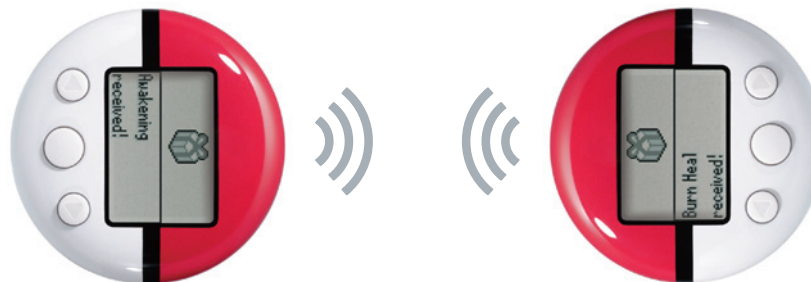
Using the Watts you've stored up by walking, you can use the Poké Radar to catch wild Pokémon. Lure a Pokémon out from the grass and the Battle begins! You can choose the commands "Attack", "Evade" and "Catch" from the Battle Screen.

You can communicate as well

You can use the infrared to communicate not only with your copy of the game, but with other Pokéwalkers as well. Communicate with other friends' Pokéwalkers and trade items!



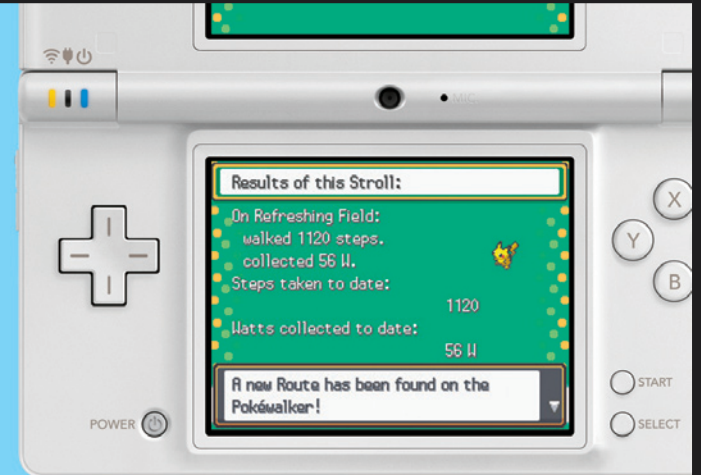
You can only communicate with the same person once each day, but you can acquire up to 10 items in one day.



Other ways to use your Pokéwalker

Nurture your Pokémon and ask your family members to help too!

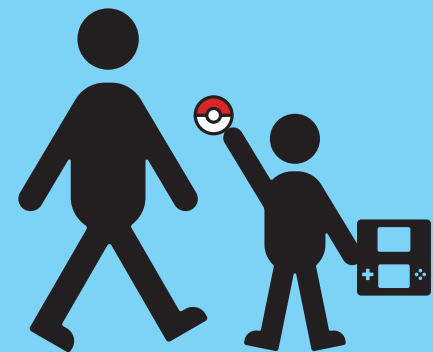
You can enjoy having your Pokémon by your side all the time, but you can also get someone else to walk about with your Pokéwalker. Every step this person makes will be counted and helps nurture your Pokémon. All members of your family can help you train your Pokémon whenever they go out!



Put a Pokémon in your Pokéwalker and hand it to someone who's going out.



When he or she comes home, get the Pokéwalker back and transmit the walking data into your game.
